Responding to and Identifying Drug Endangered Children (DEC)

Who should attend: This training is designed for law enforcement and/or DSS caseworkers or investigators who will have direct duties and responsibilities involving Drug Endangered Children.

Overview: Responding to and Identifying Drug Endangered Children will provide attendees with an introduction to South Carolina Drug Endangered Children's guidelines, which offer guidance for the multi-disciplinary response necessary when children are found to live in or exposed to environments where drugs are used, possessed, trafficked, diverted, and/or manufactured illegally. These guidelines include the response to children who are found to be present at clandestine drug labs or exposed to dangerous substances.
