



Recognizing and Responding to Child Victims of Human Trafficking for Law Enforcement

Overview: This training will assist law enforcement officers with identifying and responding to children who are potential victims of human trafficking, particularly sex trafficking. The focus will be on children at risk, children who have run away, the warning signs of an exploited child, medical treatment and follow up, gathering evidence and corroboration for the case, working with these children as victims and dealing with the non-compliant victim.

Who should attend? This training is limited to law enforcement officers who will have direct contact dealing with high and at-risk children who may be victims of human trafficking.

Continuing Education Credits: This training is approved by the SC Criminal Justice Academy for 2.75 hours.
