Overview: The intent of this training is to have attendees learn the dangers of internet websites, apps, and media sites and how predators can lure children to provide nude and/or sexually explicit materials of themselves over a phone or internet web camera. It also teaches the attendees how children unknowingly violate criminal laws when they send these nude or sexually explicit photos by any means of electronic communication. The law in S.C. and federal law still considers any sexually explicit photo or depiction of sexual activity of a person under 18 to be child pornography. Attendees will learn the laws that apply to this activity and how children are technically subjecting themselves to felony charges and lifetime sex offender registry. PowerPoint, lecture, and discussion will be utilized for this course. Presenters will be from the USC Children's Law Center and the Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force.

Who should attend: Educators, counselors, solicitors, law enforcement investigators, School Resource Officers, juvenile justice personnel, and other personnel responsible for recognizing, documenting, and investigating child abuse.
