

Child Sex Trafficking Trainer (Program Manager I)

Children's Law Center, USC School of Law, Band 07. \$55,915 or commensurate with experience. State benefits included.

This position involves the development and implementation of a comprehensive training program for child protection and related professionals related to child sex trafficking. This will include curriculum development and the delivery of training for DSS staff, incorporating DSS policy and procedures. Additionally, training will be developed and offered to staff of treatment facilities and group homes, and multi-disciplinary community professionals who work with children. The Child Sex Trafficking Trainer will also assist with development of training for law enforcement and juvenile justice professionals, and will be responsible for coordination with the DSS implementation team to ensure that training materials and delivery meet CAPTA requirements. Position requires frequent travel within the state.

Minimum qualifications include a master's degree in a related field and 5 years of relevant program experience, or a bachelor's degree and 7 years of relevant program experience. Relevant experience for this position is work related to child maltreatment, juvenile justice, or at-risk youth, such as investigation, intervention programs, or legal representation. Must be knowledgeable of laws, policies, and procedures related to child welfare.

Preferred qualifications include: (1) direct work experience with human trafficking, particularly the commercial sexual exploitation of children; (2) experience working with children who have been sexually abused; (3) training and curriculum design experience; and (4) knowledge of or experience in juvenile justice and criminal justice systems.
