Mary Fuller Everhart received her BA in Criminal Justice from St. Leo University in 1987. Ms. Everhart is employed as the Training and Development Director for Mandatory Reporting at the Children's Law Center, University of South Carolina School of Law.

Ms. Everhart has over 30 years of experience in law enforcement. She began her career with the Sumter Police Department and was employed by The South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy as a senior instructor. While employed at SCCJA, Ms. Everhart served on the Child Fatality Review Committee. She was a founding member of the South Carolina Juvenile Officer's Association, and served as an advisor on the National School Safety Board. Most recently she was employed with The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, as a Special Agent, assigned to the Pee Dee Region. While employed with SLED, Ms. Everhart investigated 287 child deaths. Ms. Everhart retired from SLED in 2001.

Ms. Everhart is co-instructor for the Department of Education Summer Institute Graduate Course: Increasing Knowledge and Advocacy for Children in Need: A School Counselor's Guide to South Carolina Legal Systems.

Ms. Everhart has done training for the SC Department of Education in the area of mandatory reporting of child abuse and neglect, including a video segment that is currently available for SC School Counselors. She is a guest speaker at the 2010 South Carolina School Counselor Association.

Ms. Everhart has trained in excess of 7,000 mandatory reporters in the last year. Ms. Everhart has taught for the Public Agency Training Council for the past six (6) years. She has taught extensively around the United States on the topic of interviewing children and on mandatory reporting of abuse and neglect. She also taught the Royal Bahamian Police in 2002.

Mandated Reporters

Mandated Reporters are required to report suspected child abuse and neglect. There are sometimes questions about what the law actually requires.

In this training we will examine the legal requirements for mandated reporting. We will also explore how these laws apply to you. We will look at how the system responds and what services are available to help with the investigation. This training is offered annually throughout the state.

This course will offer continuing education credit for EMT's, Law Enforcement, Attorneys, and Social Workers. It is anticipated to be approved for Victim Service Providers also.

The Children's Law Center
